# Lifetime Look...

The publication committee is happy to announce a new feature of the AHR magazine entitled 'Lifetime Look', an introduction to our very important AHR lifetime members. Want to become an AHR lifetime member? Just contact the AHR office at 330-784-0000! This first article introduces Vernon Ray Miller, Mini Mountain Haflingers of Dundee, Ohio. Ray celebrated 30 years of Haflinger ownership in 2014.

Ray Miller of Mini Mountain Haflingers in Dundee, Ohio purchased his first pair of Haflinger mares on a road trip with Aden and Betty Miller in 1984 to Robert MacArthurs farm in New York. The two year old mares were Patrice (TN D5) and Charme (TN D4) who were purchased on 6-3-1983. It was his third purchase, however, who will stamp her hoofs onto Ray's heart and be the main foundation mare for his entire breeding program. That mare was La-Gold.

Ray became interested in Haflingers because he had grown up with Belgians, but where he was living at the time didn't have the pasture space needed to support the big horses. Enter the Haflinger. Their smaller size was perfect for the acreage he did have. When Ray moved to his current 32 acre farm in Dundee, Ohio, he acquired as many as 16 Haflingers at one time. Currently, he owns five.

When asked what he felt was the best thing about the breed Ray answered that they are a hardy breed compared to other horses, and they easily adapt to any situation. Ray should know, he is a farrier and operates R&M Horseshoeing in Kidron, Ohio where he deals with all breeds of horses on a daily basis.

Ray enjoys showing his Haflingers in halter and pleasure driving and in the past liked to trail ride. While he doesn't admit it, he is well respected as an excellent person to prep horses for auction, shows, and inspection and classification. The attention to detail and the conditioning program he has perfected in his 30 years with the breed is not able to be duplicated. Ray has boasted many sale toppers and National Champions in the ring, for himself and his clients.

His capacity as a lifetime member and supporter of AHR has been vast. Ray has served on several committees including pedigree, judges, and also inspection and classification where he currently is a Senior C carded judge. He is also active with the Ohio Haflinger Association, the local Haflinger Regional group, where he served as trustee for 'many years'.

When asked about his most memorable Haflinger moment Ray answered that it was in 2008 when he won the open stallion/gelding driving class at the AHR Nationals with Wild Gold MMH (Winterschon CCF x Lacey Gold MMH) a gelding that he bred, raised, and trained. At that same show Wild Gold MMH was also named National Grand Champion Gelding. Quite a memory indeed!

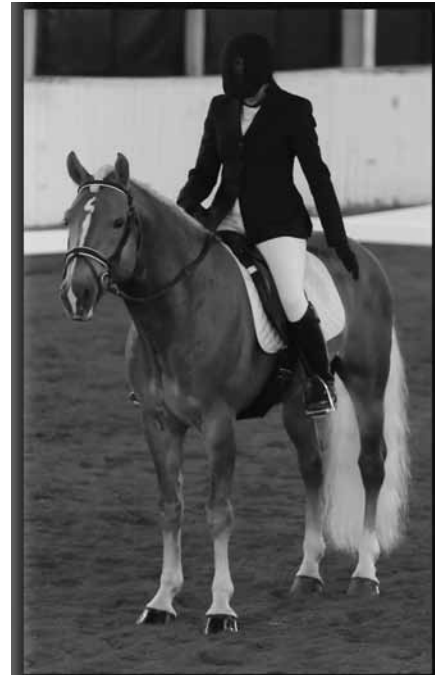

Owned by Chuck Hendershot of Hendershot Haflingers, Cameron Mills, New York and trained and shown by Jacque Woodward of Woodward Performance Haflingers, Coshocton, Ohio, Chuck and Jacque discussed the 2013 goals for Steel early in the year. As this was only his second year being shown there were lots of ideas. The first goal was to keep going with the saddle training, working especially on the English Pleasure classes. Steel had gone to Nichole Cable for some harness time and it was discussed to continue the driving portion also. To keep Steel happy and content throughout the show season a large portion of his conditioning program was spent out on the trails. When Jacque called Chuck in May and asked about taking him to a Hunter Pace, Chuck readily agreed. After the first Hunter Pace, many more followed. Steel loved the varied courses, and was beyond a natural at jumping. Chuck and Jacque discussed Steel going in the over fences classes and started taking lessons from Lisa Schott of Mt. Vernon, Ohio. While Steel is a bit eager over

fences (he MUCH prefers the faster, jumper classes to the slower, hunter over fences classes) he has untapped ability with a huge stride, and a huge jump. And anyone watching can tell he LOVES to jump!

In June, the driving training was added into the evening workouts. It was a great addition for Steel to learn to concentrate on both voice commands and the sound of something behind him along with carriages coming up beside and passing and learning to go forward and collect himself without the help from leg and seat pressure.

Of course Dressage is always the basis of training and Steel showed at almost every Haflinger show in the ridden dressage arena!

At the 2013 AHR Nationals, the early discussed, yearly goals were surpassed when Steel captured the National Champion titles of Open English Pleasure, Green Horse Under Saddle, and Green Equitation classes, as well as placing 9<sup>th</sup> in the Open Pleasure driving (after 4 very LONG cuts) and also placing well in the hunter over fences and driven and ridden dressage classes, it was time to take a short break. Then the fall Hunter Paces kicked back up and the talk of Western Dressage classes being added to the Haflinger Championship Challenge circuit. Since Jacque wanted to find out more about this discipline she asked Chuck if she and Steel could attend some clinics to learn more about this growing discipline. So far, it seems as though once again, Steel can do whatever is asked and enjoy it!



Congratulations to Alexandria Schut. She was state runner-up in the Michigan FFA Equine Proficiency Award program. In addition, Alex was elected the Michigan FFA State President for 2014-15. She joins Jessica Shanahan of Ohio (State FFA President a few years ago) as state FFA leaders who grew up with the Haflinger breed!

## Wintersons Gold MMH wins at Sunshine State CDE

As a professional horseperson, the barn is a continuous rolling tide of change. People and equines flow through the barn on a monthly basis. Some stay for days, some for months. I am tremendously blessed with my long-term horse relationships. One equine in particular remains a favorite to work with. Spike, as he is known around the barn, is that exceptional animal.

Wintersons Gold MMH (aka "Spike") has been in training with me for over five years. He was bred by Ray Miller of Mini Mountain Haflingers in Dundee, Ohio. Sired by Winterschon CCF and out of Lacey Gold MMH, Spike was purchased by Max Montoya when he was just a foal. After being started by John Yoder in Ohio, Max brought him along to me for polishing. Max and Spike had been competing in Haflinger breed shows, in hand and were aiming to compete in harness. From the beginning, Spike had a good head on his withers. He's a smart pony who's quick to learn.

Spike and Max moved from the breed show arena to the combined driving world. They both loved the marathon and cones. The dressage was more difficult, but I worked with Spike every day to be a solid dressage pony. Moving up the levels, Max matched Spike with a mate for pair driving. As the pair developed, it became plain that it wasn't meant to be. Max leased and then purchased a pair of horses, opening up the chance for Spike to be driven by someone new.

That new person is Steve Wilson's grandson, Avery Wilson. Steve and wife Laura Lee Brown own Hermitage Farm, home of the Hermitage International Training Center in Goshen, Kentucky. As the trainer at HITC, I matched up Avery and Spike, a dynamic duo. Avery had just outgrown a Welsh pony. He was ready for a little more speed and power, something Spike could provide while being safe. Avery began piloting Spike at the Preliminary level in April 2013. They competed in four CDE's and multiple schooling events over the year.

In the meantime, Spike is in continuous training at HITC. Our winter training facility is the Grand Oaks Resort in Weirsdale, Florida. Due to his school schedule, Avery can only compete in a couple of shows during the winter season. I jumped at the opportunity to drive the pony in combined driving competition. Mr. Wilson agreed that it would be good for the pony to have more competition experience. It will also assist me in coaching Avery to know exactly how the pony drives in a non-training setting. Our first outing: The Sunshine State CDE at the Florida Horse Park.

Spike and I didn't vary in our normal training except for a few key concentrations.



Number one, dressage. We had a couple strikes against us, I was using a marathon carriage for all three phases and Spike isn't the biggest, fanciest moving pony in the sport. He's a nice mover, but not the most impressive. I planned on gaining those points back by being as accurate as possible. Stepping up to intermediate, Spike needed to have crisp transitions from working trot, collected trot, and lengthened trot. I personally needed to hone my one-handed driving skills. We spent most days leading up to the competition

working on these key elements, though I didn't actually learn the test until the week before the competition.

Number two, marathon. The Grand Oaks has a great set-up for conditioning. There are a couple of nice long hills, which are wonderful for building hind muscle and stamina, as well as a track if you need to put in some flat miles. We concentrated on hills for fitness and used dressage for our flat work. A couple of training sessions, at least two weeks before competition, we schooled obstacles. Both times, we worked on keeping up speed in the obstacle, especially galloping when asked and stopping afterward. Important to spend and conserve energy in the right places. Here we

had a few advantages, Spike likes going fast, I was using a light navigator, and our Puddlejumper marathon carriage hugs the ground but is lightweight. Unfortunately, it doesn't have delayed steering, which gave us a disadvantage in the obstacles. We had to choose our routes wisely based on these facts.

Number three, cones. Spike and I both love cones, so this was the phase I was least concerned about. We only practiced a few times, concentrating on driving straight, keeping the speed without breaking from the trot.

Several drivers at Grand Oaks had set up a cones course from this past fall's World Pony Championships which we gave a couple of successful runs. It was a nice set-up for the weekend of competition.

We moved to the Florida Horse Park on Tuesday. This was an all-day affair, since not only were Spike and I showing, but we had three other HITC turnouts. Owner Steve Wilson was competing his advanced pair of Lipizzan horses, Max Montoya was driving his pair of Georgian Grande horses Intermediate, and Charlie Freibert was driving his Welsh Cob preliminary. We had three trailers to move all horses, carriages, golf carts, and equipment. But HITC has a great crew that works together well and the production went without any problems.

All horses and drivers were worked on a cool, rainy Wednesday. Thursday Spike and I did dressage early in the day, directly after the Advanced vet check. I had plenty of pony, going into warm-up, perfect for our goals. My goals in warm-up were to work transitions, develop a solid lengthened trot, and establish a connection throughout his body. We were ready for our dressage test. We flowed through the test, some excellent sections and a few bobbles. Overall, I was pleased with our performance. Spike gave me everything he had at a given moment. We ended up in first after dressage by two points.

The next day Spike was ridden (a light day to prepare for marathon day on Saturday) while I coached Max and Charlie for their dressage tests. After dressage, we all walked the marathon course again. It is important to know exactly where you're driving on Saturday. The surer you are, the faster you can drive. My navigator and I agreed on all our routes, feeling prepared for Saturday's competition.

Saturday morning dawned nicely; we were up early walking obstacles one last time. We "dressed" our carriages with spare whips, seat belts, times for the section, and any extra tools for the marathon. Marathon day feels like preparing to go into battle. Spike and I were the second to go off of the HITC group. We had a wonderful marathon. Fitness had paid off, no trouble making our section times. We made the walk time with over a minute to spare. Then came the obstacles. We flew through the hazards with ease. He was turning and listening like super pony he is.



Amy and I worked together in each obstacle to go as fast as possible. Between the hazards, we were so relaxed and happy that we hummed some of our favorite movie music. By the end, we had plenty of pony left and walked into the finish. At the end of the day, we won three obstacles and the second place driver won four, so we were narrowly beaten on the marathon. But we were still .70 points ahead overall heading into cones!

Each cone down is three points, we didn't even have one ball in hand. It was to be an exciting cones course. Spike and I were ready, though. After a great warm-up session with help from our Hermitage Team, we headed into the cones warm-up relaxed and confident. The second place driver went first, with a double clean round. No gifts here, I was going to have to fight for first place. That we did, going in with a blistering course, no balls down. Spike and I won with the .70 margin we had entered the cones course with.



It was a great feeling, to pilot such a wonderful pony to a first place finish. Avery will be showing Spike at the next competition. He will greatly benefit from knowledge gained at the Sunshine State CDE. Then Spike and I will round out the competition winter season at Live Oak in March. It will be a fantastic weekend, driving our most talented pony around a world-class course.

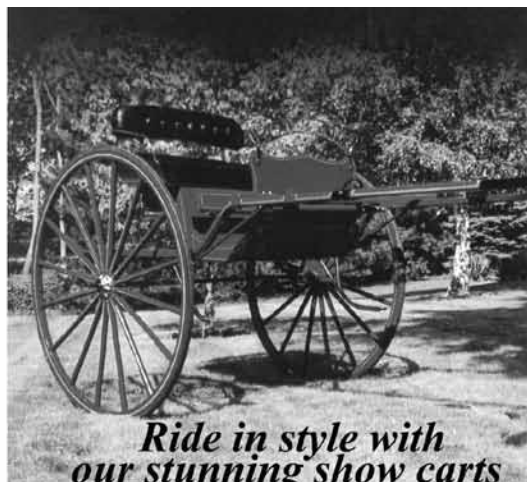

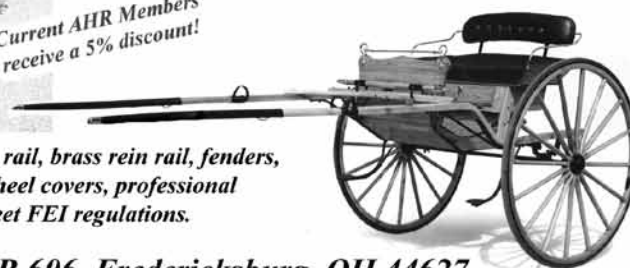

It was a full house one day but I am sure it was because Guy McLean had the arena immediately after we finished! A local construction company made the obstacles specifically for our event. Each hazard had four fences, a center square fence and a barn. They were very nice! We had a nice variety of competitors: two single minis, four single horses: a Morgan, a Friesian, a Fjord, and a Haflinger, and two pairs: a set of Fjords and a pair of Hackney ponies. Almost everyone was cautious the first day (not the hackney team – they FLEW every time) but by the end most were cantering the hazards. It was a blast! We had never let Ace canter in the carriage before but we cut him loose in the large arena. He was even switching leads flying through the hazards. Our time the first day was 1:14 and the last day was 53 seconds! The best we placed was third; no one could catch the minis, so I was happy with third. Since it was the first year,

there were no divisions; we all ran the same course. The mini drivers had enough room to drive a six horse mini hitch and a wagon through the hazards!

It was a great couple of days. We had so much fun and made several new friends. I was happy to get the chance to participate and have my Haflinger do well in front of so many people. Next year will be even better! Now, I am excited for spring! (Although, it certainly isn't here, I couldn't even get in the barn this morning. The door was frozen shut! )

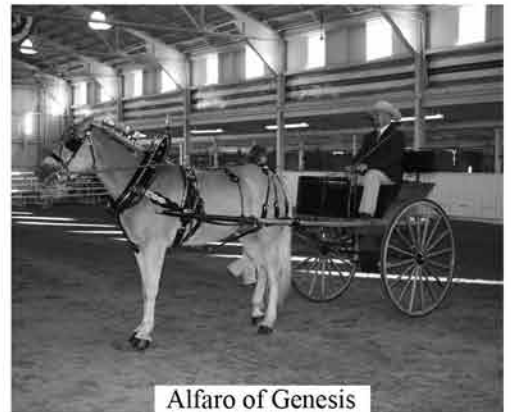

## *Some exciting changes for 2014 ....*

1. Any first place and/or Champion and Reserve Champion Futurity Class winner will be eligible for a spot in the fall sale! The AHR has created a special slot in the sale for Futurity winners. Futurity winners consigned will be offered with a no-sale option.

# 2013 Indiana State Fair and AHR National Draft Haflinger Show

The 2013 Indiana State Fair and AHR National Draft Haflinger Show were held in Indianapolis on August 15-18. The ISF was different this year for 2 reasons; (1) it was the AHR National Haflinger Show and (2) it was held in a new arena due to the renovations ongoing in the Coliseum. This is a newly constructed arena that replaced the old open covered arena that was behind the coliseum. It is referred to as the Youth Arena and is a multipurpose facility.

This was the first year the Indiana State Fair Draft Haflinger Show was recognized as the National Draft Show by the American Haflinger Registry. There was a nice area set up for pictures and Lou Sutton made and donated nice plaques with a horseshoe and name of the class for the winners. There were a few comments of why was there no one there representing the AHR. I have since found out that the Sutton family that usually does this sort of thing had a Show of their own at the same time. I understand they have made some changes so that they can attend in 2014. (As a side note, it is my opinion that the Sutton's do more to promote the AHR than any of the rest of us).

The new arena was a little smaller than the Coliseum but as large as a lot of the arena's that the Draft hitches show in. The show was run the same way as the ISF is always run and that is the Haflingers show along with the Belgians and Draft ponies. This works out well in that everyone has ample time to get ready for their next class without being rushed. It also works out that each breed has about 3 classes each night which keeps the horses fresh.

The hitch classes are all held in the early evening and the Haflinger halter classes are held on Friday morning. The exception to this is that the Youth decorating and showmanship classes were held on Saturday morning. The hitch classes were run the same way they have always been run that being, according to the number of entries, they are split in two or three sections so everyone has ample room to show their hitch. After everyone has shown, all hitches are brought into the arena for placing. This make for quite a site when you have 12 six-horse hitches in the ring at the same time.

The Haflinger show started on Thursday evening with the Two-Horse Mare hitch class. There were 10 entries in class with the winner being Second Star Haflingers from Churubusco, Indiana. The next Haflinger class was the Unicorn class and it had 14 entries with Triple F Farms of Greenville, Ohio coming out on top. Next up was the Senior Youth Cart class for youth 15-18 won by Kirsten Fross from Broken Spoke Haflingers, Camden, Ohio. This was followed by the Women's Cart class and the

winning entry Weeden's Lockerby Lur Struthan Haflingers, Ariss, Ontario, Canada, with Holly Purcell on the lines. The final class of the night was the Junior Youth Team Driving with seven entries. Mary Desaulnics driving for Brugger's Other Farm was the winner.

Friday morning started at 7:30 AM with the Halter classes. Stallion classes were first followed by the mares, then the gelding and finally the group or multi-horse classes. The Stallion classes were rather light with the oldest horse to be shown being Waylon CLA in the two and under three class and he was the only entry in the class. Fire Ace PPGH was the winner out of seven entries in the one and less than two class and New Magic Superman DH4 won the Foal class. Although Waylon CLA, shown by Broken Spoke Haflingers, Camden, Ohio was the only one in his class, he was named Junior and Grand Champion Stallion. Fire Ace PPGH, shown by Eric Geiman, Arcanum, Ohio, was name Reserve Junior & Reserve Grand Champion Stallion.

The mare classes followed with a total of 44 horses shown in six classes. In the end, the Junior Champion Mare was Princess Sophia JH, shown by Jameson Haflingers, Greentown, Indiana. Reserve Junior Champion Mare was Suzanna's Sassafras DH4, shown by Derrer's Haflingers, Taylorsville, North Carolina. The Senior Champion & Grand Champion Mare was L-Abby PPGH, shown by Penn Grove Haflingers, Portland, Indiana and the Reserve Senior & Reserve Grand Champion mare was Calypso, exhibited by Second Star Haflingers, Churubusco, Indiana.

There were 22 geldings shown in two classes – five and older with 13 and four and under with nine. The Reserve Grand Champion Gelding was Willo's Chip, shown by Triple F Farms, Greenville, Ohio and the Grand Champion Gelding was Willo's Captain CHA, exhibited by Penn Grove Haflingers.

Selected as Best of Breed was Willo's Captain CHA, owned by Bill & Shirley Powell and shown by Eric Geiman. This was the second year in a row that Captain has won this distinction.

In summary, there were 80 individual horses shown in the Halter classes assuming those shown in the multi-horse classes were also shown as individuals. Knowing that there were several Haflingers shown in the Hitch classes that were not shown at Halter, my guess is there were at least 130 Haflingers shown during the Fair.

The Friday evening Hitch classes started with the Two-Horse Team of Geldings/Stallions. Following a Belgian Four-Horse class was the Senior Youth Team Driving. There were eight

entries and Kirsten Fross, Broken Spoke Haflingers won this class. The next Haflinger class was the Junior Youth Cart with 11 youth exhibiting. Mary Desaulniers was again the winner in this Youth Class for youth 10-14 years old. The 11<sup>th</sup> and last class of the evening show was the Haflinger Mare Cart – Man or Woman to Drive. This class had 19 entries split into two sections with Evan Wall driving his mare taking home the Blue Ribbon.

Saturday morning the Youth Decorating & Showmanship classes were held after the same classes for the Belgian youth. This ended the four classes for the Youth exhibitors. As is true with the hitch classes for the youth, they were judged in Junior & Senior divisions. Starting 1<sup>st</sup> was the Decorating class. In case you are not familiar with a decorating class, each exhibitor must braid the tail, place a bow proper in it, roll the mane and place five flowers in it, all within a 30 minute time limit. They can have a handler to hold their horse but they cannot physically help in any way. After the judge completed his task, he determined Mary Desaulniers as the winner in the Junior division and Kathryn Purcell in the Senior division.

The Showmanship class was held after the Decorating as most use the same horse because they are to be shown as they are after the decorating. Megan Arnold was the winner in the Junior division and Kathryn Purcell won this class after also winning the Decorating for the Senior Division.

The youth can qualify to be selected as the Outstanding Youth Exhibitor by competing in all four Youth classes. In the past, only one youth was selected, but after suggestions, winners were selected in both divisions. This award is sponsored by the Arnold Family Haflingers and there is more detail on this in the article on page 41.

At the conclusion of the judging of the Decorating & Showmanship classes, the Junior and Senior winners were announced. The winner in the Senior division was Kathryn Purcell. Kathryn had competed for the award for the past three years since it was started. She is from Canada and is sponsored by Weeden's Lockerby Lur Struthan Haflingers. Winning the Junior division was Mary Desaulniers, sponsored by Brugger's Other Farm. Both girls received a plaque along with a monetary award for winning their respective Divisions. This also qualifies them for being Outstanding Youth Showman of the 2013 Indiana State Fair.

The Saturday evening show began with the presentation of the Mary Elizabeth Frey Memorial Award that is awarded to the Outstanding Youth Showman of the 2013 Indiana State Fair. Both Kathryn and Mary along with Jim Arnold, representing Arnold Family Haflingers entered the arena for the presentation. This year's winner, as well as all the previous winners, came from the Junior division and was Mary Desaulniers. For her accomplishments, she received another monetary award

along with the Memorial Award recognizing her as the 2013 Outstanding Youth Exhibitor of the ISF. Mary is the daughter of Andre Desaulniers and Colleen Crawford, granddaughter of Bob Crawford of Shady Maple Haflingers and niece of Kevin Crawford. She lives in Stoney Point, Ontario, Canada. She is 12 years old and in the seventh grade at Annunciation Catholic School. Mary and her mother help and show with Dave & Phyllis Brugger.

The first Hitch class was the Men's Cart. This class always has the most entries and this year was no exception with 23. After three splits and a work off, Blair Purcell, driving for Weeden's Lockerby Lur Struthan Haflingers won the class. Next up for the "Flingers" was the 4-Horse Hitch with 14 entries. Evan Wall, driving for Penn Grove Haflingers came in first place.

The last class of the evening and the 2013 ISF was the Six-Horse Hitch class. This is always the highlight of any show and with 12 entries – 72 Haflingers & 12 wagons in the arena at the same time for the placings, it is quite a sight to see. The entry of Penn Grove Haflingers, Bill & Shirley Powell of Portland, Indiana, and again driven by Evan Wall as in the 4-up was the last hitch standing in the arena after the placings. As is the case with the Sip-up in most shows, horses from different owners are combined to make up the hitch. This is a tribute to how everyone gets along in the Draft community, not saying that others do not do the same. In the case of this hitch, the Lead team of mares came from Evan Wall, the Swing team from Tim Arnold with the Wheel team belonging to the Powell's

In closing, although a little different, it was another great Indiana State Fair and made even better by the fact it was also the AHR National Draft Show. This is made possible by the ISF Director Bryan Messersmith, Justin Carey, Lisa Nebergall and the rest of the folks behind the scene that make it the show that everyone looks forward to year in and year out. Several different Haflinger exhibitors did well during the course of the show and congratulations to one and all. In my humble review, I would say Bill & Shirley Powell of Penn Grove Haflingers, along with the help of Eric Geiman and Evan Wall, had the best outcome of all. This is by the fact that they won Grand Champion Mare with L-Abby PPGH, Grand Champion Gelding and Best of Breed with Willo's Captain CHA, winning both the four and six Horse Hitch classes and placing well in other classes as well.. These comments may appear a little biased but we started showing not long after they did and have become very good friends. We stable with them whenever possible and help each other as we can. They have also helped us in a lot of other ways but I will not comment further.

Now it is time to start thinking about the 2014 Indiana State Fair with the show back in the newly renovated Coliseum.

## *The Mary Elizabeth Frey Memorial Award Outstanding Youth Exhibitor at the Indiana State Fair*

**T**his story is about the creation of the Outstanding Youth Exhibitor Award that is presented at the Indiana State Fair. It will explain the details of how it came to be, the story behind the name, the requirements to qualify and win the award and the winners to date.

Before I go further, I need to apologize to those involved for not getting this article completed before now. I started it after the 2011 Indiana State Fair and now the 2013 Fair is history and I am finally getting it finished and submitted. I will claim age as being my excuse as I find my "can do" cannot keep up with my "want to" as I get older.

The idea for this award was suggested to me during the winter following the 2010 Indiana State Fair by my son, Tim & his wife Beth. They, knowing of my involvement with youth over the years and how I felt about things concerning youth activities, that I would be receptive to the idea. This would be awarded to the Youth who did the best in the Youth classes starting at the 2011 ISF.

The next step was to contact the folks at the State Fair. I called Bryan Messersmith, the director of the Draft Horse Department, to discuss our idea. Not only was he very receptive of the idea, he began making suggestions for splitting the Team driving class into two divisions and adding a decorating class. The youth classes were now set with the Junior exhibitors (those from 10 to 14) and the Senior exhibitors (those 15 to 18) each having four classes in which to show.

The decorating class was a new experience for the Haflinger youth. Thanks to the Belgian Horse Association, we were able to obtain and follow their criteria for the decorating class. It basically requires the youth to prepare the horse as if to show in a hitch class. That requires the youth to braid the tail and place a bow in the tail, roll the mane and place the decorations in it. There is a 30 minute time limit to complete the above criteria. The plans were now in place with the 2011 Indiana State Fair being the 1<sup>st</sup> year for the award. To be eligible, the youth had

to show in all four classes in their division, cart, team, decorating and showmanship. The winner receives the distinction of being named the Outstanding Youth Exhibitor, a nice plaque and monetary award, presented during the Saturday evening show.

The Award is named the Mary Elizabeth Frey Memorial Award. It is a plaque with the above inscription, a picture of Mary Elizabeth as well as "Outstanding Youth Exhibitor of the (*year*) Indiana State Fair.

Mary Elizabeth, the young lady for whom the award is named, was my cousin's granddaughter. She lived in Louisville, Kentucky and loved horses. Our first meeting with her was when she came up to our place for a family reunion. She spent most of her time at the barn with our Haflingers.

In 2009, Mary came to the Fair and helped us show our Haflingers. She was a big help and enjoyed the Fair. The highlight for her was riding up on the wagon with me in the Team hitch class.

The Fair was discussed throughout the year and plans were put in place for her return in 2010. On Monday, before we were to move into the Fair on Wednesday, I received a call asking when she should be up to help. This was in the afternoon and later that same day we received the horrible news that she had been hit and killed crossing the street. We learned later that she was on her way to show a friend a new blouse she had purchased to wear when she rode on the wagon again. This is the reason for the name as it is our way to honor her memory. It is sponsored by the Arnold Family.

There were eight youth who qualified for the award by participating in all four classes in 2011, the first year the award was presented. The winner of the 1<sup>st</sup> Mary Elizabeth Frey Outstanding Youth Award was Kirsten Fross, daughter of Nick & Laura Clark, Broken Spoke Haflingers and the granddaughter of Bill Jameson & Linda Jameson. Kirsten lives in Eaton, Ohio where she is active in both 4-H and FFA. She is treasurer of her 4-H Horse & Pony club, the Happy

Hoofers and is a seven year member. Kirsten also competes in the FFA animal judging and is a member of the Western Ohio Pony Breeders Association. Kirsten shows both styles of Haflingers – Draft and Pleasure.

Now on to 2012 and a recap of the youth portion of the Indiana State Fair... There were 35 registered exhibitors showing Haflingers at the Fair. Thirty-five exhibitors may not sound like many to some but when you consider 20 – 6 horse hitches of Haflingers (that is 120 Haflinger's alone) it adds up to a lot of Haflingers. There were more Haflingers per class than any of the Belgians or Draft Ponies that show at the same time. Out of the 35 exhibitors, there were 30 kids showing Haflingers in the youth classes.

This is another example that showing Draft type Haflingers is a family affair. With 30 youth showing it is not only a family affair but includes friends and their equipment as well.

The Senior cart & Junior team classes were held on Thursday night. There were 14 exhibitors in the Senior cart class with Kirsten Fross the winner. Eleven Youth participated in the Junior team class with Lauren Flory claiming the blue ribbon. Friday night saw 15 exhibitors with Maddison Houser winning the Junior cart class and Emily Ladd was the winner in the Senior team class. All the above classes were split into 2 divisions so everyone had ample room to exhibit their abilities.

Saturday morning began with the Decorating classes and had all contestants in the arena at the same time. The winner in the Senior division was Kathryn Purcell and the Junior division was won by Megan Arnold. Following the decorating class was

the Showmanship class for all. Austin Kukal was named the Showmanship winner in the Junior division and Emily Ladd was the recipient of the Senior Showmanship award.

Of the 30 youth exhibitors, 14 (almost half) qualified for the Mary Elizabeth Frey Memorial Award having participated in all four of the classes in their respective divisions. There were six exhibitors in the Junior division and eight in the Senior. The award was presented on Saturday evening while the judge was making his final placings of the Haflinger six-horse hitch class.

She also is on her school swim team and student council. Besides showing Haflingers in driving classes, she shows her Quarter horse in riding events as they do not have a Haflinger to ride. That is in process for this year as they are having a Haflinger broke to ride at this time.

Now to the 2013 Indiana State Fair and the highlights of the Youth classes. In 2013 there were 27 youth that competed in one or more of the four Youth classes in each division - 13

in the Junior and 14 in the Senior. Out of this total, there were nine youth that competed in all the required classes and therefore qualified for the awards.

Things were changed a little in 2013 in that the winner in each division – Junior & Senior, was awarded a plaque and monetary gift for their accomplishments. These awards were presented at the conclusion of the Showmanship judging. One of these two individuals would then be the winner of the title of Outstanding Youth Exhibitor at the 2013 Indiana State Fair.

The Senior winner for 2013 was Kathryn Purcell. Kathryn is from Canada and is sponsored by Weeden's Lockerby Lur Struthan Haflingers, Ariss, Ontario, Canada. Kathryn had competed for the award every year since its inception. She received the plaque recognizing her as the Outstanding Senior exhibitor for 2013. The winner of the Junior group, also from Canada, receiving a similar award as Kathryn, was Mary Desaulniers. The outstanding Youth exhibitor is then decided between these two individuals as they were the winners of their respective division.

## Parasite control, resistance and possible changes to your worming program

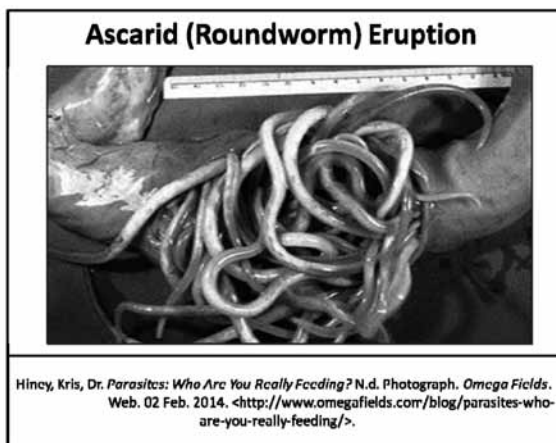
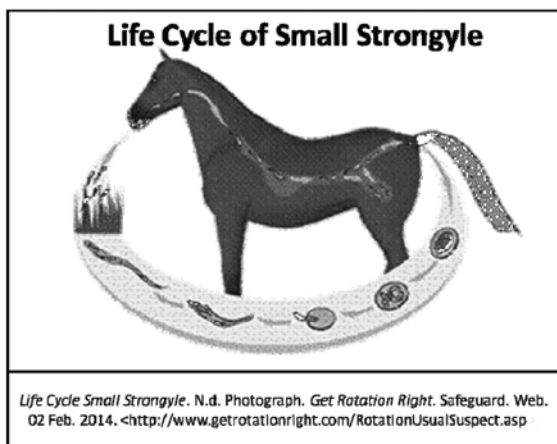
We all could save a buck or two here and there, right? What about \$100 a year, or even \$200? What could you have bought with that extra cash? New Tack? Bedding? Save up money to breed your mare to that dream stallion? You might be asking yourself what does this have to do with deworming your horses? Well that fact is that traditional horsemen and woman alike have been worming their horses for decades every 60-90 days on a routine basis; others after every full moon, or not even at all. The reality is that within the last five years researchers and veterinarians have encountered an issue that will affect all of us...parasite resistance! This can lead to excess expenditures in buying deworming products that are not doing anything for you, or your horse(s). Before I go on, the following information is a "broad" overview of parasite resistance and for those of you whom are not familiar with this issue; the next few topics will allow you to develop a working knowledge of basic equine parasitology.

### Types of Parasites:

There are various types of equine parasites that can have an effect on our horses, but the number the most common threat typically in the U.S. is dealing with small & large strongyles. They are everywhere in pastures! There are many different variants of this species, however they all populate in the horses cecum and large colon. After the worm has attached to the ventral portion of the colon on the intestinal lining or mucosa, they form a cyst like, hollow structure that will be in a dormant or non-active phase for days to weeks to even months. Typically strongyles are prevalent in late winter, into spring. It is suggested that there is some sort of environmental signal that activates these adults to lay eggs, although it's not well understood at the time. Then the adult will return to the lumen of the intestine, or off of the wall and begin laying eggs which will be excreted with the horse's feces. The eggs then are dropped onto the ground in the pasture and will begin to hatch into four different larval stages.

Typically, extreme weather such as winter snow and ice and hot, dry summers will slow down or restrict growth of these organisms. After they reach the third larval stage [equivalent to the size of a hair follicle] they become a threat to horses, and your horse will naturally graze fresh pasture grass infected with the larvae. After ingestion, they surpass the stomach and small intestine and will gather again in the cecum and large colon. This entire process can last anywhere from 12-14 weeks, sometimes much longer. The issue is a 1,000 pound horse will defecate at the rate of about 30 pounds of manure a day. One pound of feces can have thousands of strongyle eggs, in a severe infestation. That is a lot of eggs in one pasture. If too many of the young larvae accumulate in the intestine, alongside the egg laying adults, the strongyles create a block in the intestinal lining and cause numerous problems for our horses. Typical signs of an accumulation of these parasites are lethargy, unthrift fullness, and severe diarrhea alongside going off feed and may even become dehydrated. In severe cases, this can cause impaction and eruption of the small intestine and/or colic which unfortunately is all too common in our horses here in the United States.

The next common threat to horse owners is the Ascarid, or roundworm. Most often, these parasites are an issue in our younger horses from foals to yearlings and even two-year olds. The life cycle is similar to the strongyles, however the Ascarid eggs are extremely tough and will survive up to 5-8 years in pastures before being picked up by your horse. When the eggs are ingested by the horse, they hatch and thrive in the small intestine. Here is where they become a threat. After these eggs hatch, they will literally tunnel through the intestinal wall and into veins. This blood flow allows them to travel throughout the horses entire body and end in the essentials, the liver, the lungs and the heart. After entering the lungs, the horses will cough up the worms and re-ingest them, taking them right back into the small intestine. At this point, they will begin laying eggs, alongside the other adults, and can cause impaction, colic or eruption of the small intestine if not managed properly.





## Preventative Measures

So, the question that arises is, how do I deworm my horse to aid against all these parasites? A simple answer to that question is “Perform a **Fecal Egg Count**” or “FEC.” This method can be done by your local veterinarian or there are many laboratories that you can send samples to. Although I highly recommend that you consult your local veterinarian and devise a plan to manage your specific protocol. By performing an FEC, we are able to see how many eggs per gram (epg) there are and gauge your horse’s parasite type & load. The most common parasites found are small strongyles, ascarids, occasionally pinworms, seldomly bots for this specific test.

### How?

Getting a Fecal Egg Count performed is as simple as you taking a fresh fecal ball, placing it into a zip lock bag, labeling it with the horses name and taking it to the vet clinic or lab for testing.

### So you send off the samples, now what?

The lab technician and/or veterinarian will determine the amount of epg via microscope and then classify your horses either:

*A low shedder* (under 200 EPG Eggs Per Gram)

*A moderate* (Over 200 but under 500 EPG Eggs Per Gram)

*A high risk shedder* (Over 500 Eggs Per Gram)

**Why is this important you ask?** The reality and the point I want to drive home with this article, and if you only get to learn one fact after reading this entire piece, I want you to remember this: **20% of the horses on a farm carry over 80% of the parasite load!** If you can determine which horses are carrying the most parasites, you can effectively treat them, usually more often, whereas those horses with low burdens may only need wormed twice a year. Ultimately, saving you time and money!

My suggestion is that you deworm your horses and 7-14 days

afterwards, perform an FEC on the entire herd to determine if you have any resistance and you will know the parasite load for each individual. Please note that a FEC of “0” does not mean that our horse is free of parasites.

It is important that you perform a FEC, as it has a dual purpose: determine parasite load and you can track resistance to the type of dewormer that you are using. Your horses are different from every other horse on this earth. When you shop for a dewormer, look beyond the brand name, and look at the scientific name. Typically the scientific name is in smaller font, directly below the brand name. Such names include ivermectin, oxibendazole [Anthelcide EQ], fenbendazole [Panacur PowerPac), etc. Rotate your dewormer scientific classes, NOT brand names. If you find a horse to be resistant to a particular product, give them another product and then perform a FEC to determine if resistance occurs. If not, follow the above treatment guidelines and/or directions of your corresponding veterinarian. Examples of treatment methods can be seen in the previous tables. These are examples only. It should not matter whether the dewormer is pelleted or administered as a paste, although most are produced as a paste.

### Saving Money?

As equine enthusiasts, we have the ability to perform fecal egg counts which tend to be inexpensive and prevent long term heartaches for you, your horse’s health and your wallet. If you can prevent a \$5,000 colic surgery by paying for a \$15.00 FEC, wouldn’t you do it? A few side notes and random facts that I have noticed after performing numerous FEC’s myself: Young horses under the age of 4 are particularly susceptible to high elevations of parasite loads. If you decide to treat for ascarids and roundworms it has been proven to be affective with the use of Moxidectins [such as Quest Plus]. However, I will caution you to not use this product in foals less than 4 months of age as it has been known to cause severe illness & even death. If you have a new horse coming to your farm that you just recently purchased,

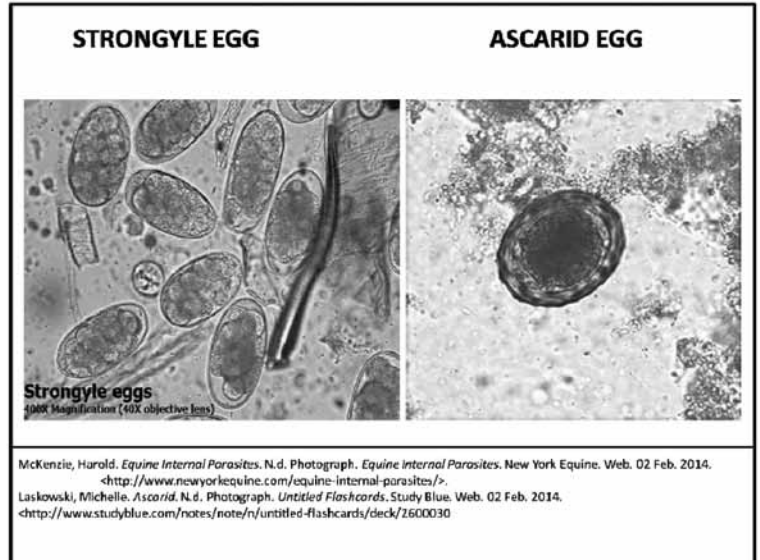

no matter whom you purchased him/her from, no matter what that previous owners reputation is, perform a FEC! Most often, I treat my own new horses with Panacur PowerPac5 daily for 5 days, and then perform a FEC.

In summary, FEC's are an inexpensive way for you to save money and allow your horses to live with hopefully a controlled parasite load, one that each farm will differ. Always contact your local veterinarian for advice. 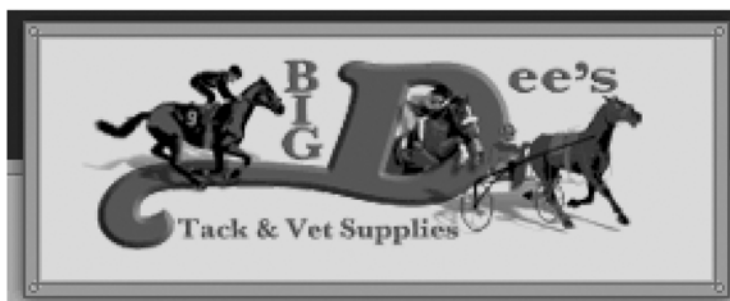

## AHR Board of Director's Meeting February 2014

The February 2014 meeting was called to order by Brian Mitteer at 8:03p.m. (EST). Attending were: Susie Haszelbart, Chuck Hendershot, Ian Wengerd, Andrew Yoder, Paul Sutton, Melanie Cornman and Ruth Schwab.

I. Old Business

II. Office Update - For the month of January 2014, I completed 4 foal registrations and 6 transfers. There were 183 stallions renewed for 2013 and 127 so far for 2014. We currently have 514 members for 2014 and 468 2013 members that have not yet renewed. We have 15 Youth members in 2014 and 27 2013 members that have not yet renewed. There are 40 magazine subscribers and renewal reminders were recently sent out for expired subscriptions. During January our Website homepage was viewed 3,181 times. There were 899 visits to the classified page and 624 to the member farms page. We received a total of 316 foal registrations and 1,194 transfers in 2013.

III. Committee Reports

1. AHR Youth - Lisa Matheny – Chair, Dave Wilson – co-Chair; Members: Lisa Schott, Sherry Bradshaw, Ian Wengerd. Spring Youth Newsletter is in process.

2. By-Laws - Paul Sutton – Chair; Members: Ian Wengerd, Brian Mitteer, Andrew Yoder. Nothing new to report.

3. Classification - Bill Hendershot – Chair; Members: Chuck Hendershot, Jennifer Rousseau, Robert Eicher, Ray Miller.

New Business : The committee has had a meeting with all members present, all concerns expressed by the AHR Board have been addressed. We have arrived at solutions and a draft of the proposal is being prepared for presentation. A request was received for 2014 classification to be held in Wisconsin, I advised the individual that a location had been set for 2014, and explained the need for classifications to be completely self supporting and that I would work up a projected cost and put her request on file for 2015 if she felt they could attain sufficient participation waiting her response.

4. Finance - Chuck Hendershot – Chair; Members: Board of Directors (Office Consultant Ruth Schwab). Chuck will send specifics. Chuck will send budget to Board.

5. Futurity – SIP - Robert Eicher – Chair; Members: Paul Sutton, Mahlon Miller, Doug Sutherland, Steve Webel

The futurity committee had three meetings in the past month via conference call. Included with this report will be an updated list of futurity rules (coming from Paul Sutton). We are asking for board approval of the updated rules along with several additional changes. The changes we are proposing are as follows:

1. Beginning this year, bred mares will need to be nominated for the AHR futurity by December 31<sup>st</sup> for the resulting foal to become futurity eligible. Fee will be \$20.
2. Current coggins test and health papers will be required to show at the futurity.
3. The weanling classes will no longer be split draft/pleasure, all weanlings will show in one division. There will be four splits: senior and junior colt, senior and junior filly.
4. We are limiting payouts to the first six places. We will continue to place the first 10 horses with ribbons.
5. All SIP and futurity payout and calculation formulas are to be available on-line.
6. All futurity entries not entered and paid by the August 1<sup>st</sup> deadline will need to pay a 100% penalty in order to be able to show at the futurity.
7. We are asking the Board for permission to create a spot in the fall sale for futurity horses. Our plan is any first place, champion and reserve champion of each age group would have the option of entering his horse in this select spot of the sale. Entry fee and commission would be the same as the sale horses. Entries would have a no-sale option if they provide the sale committee with a confidential minimum bid.
8. The committee eliminated the current provision that a horse of any age can buy into the futurity as long as all fees and penalties are paid. If a horse is not enrolled as a weanling or yearling (with penalty) – he becomes ineligible for AHR futurity.
9. The committee is working to come up with a plan that would create substantial payouts for the three year old classes. Beginning this year the futurity money raised from the stallion service auction will all be paid out in the three year old classes. Our hope is that this will have a trickle-down effect and encourage more enrollments, larger classes and larger payouts at the two year old level.

Respectfully submitted, Robert Eicher. Paul moved, Chuck 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed.
